Happy Valley Parks, Recreation & Open Space Plan



THE CITY OF HAPPY VALLEY IS KICKING OFF DEVELOPMENT OF A PARKS & RECREATION PLAN, AND WE WANT TO HEAR FROM YOU!

We've heard that residents want a community center, more ballfields, trails & paths, and a new community park. We want to put these ideas into action — and develop a plan for how we build parks and provide recreation amenities in the short and long term future.

WHY NOW?

The City Council voted unanimously to withdraw from the North Clackamas Parks and Recreation District (NCPRD). Effective at the end of the year, the City of Happy Valley will be providing parks and recreation services to the residents of Happy Valley. Now, we need a plan to guide the City's future parks and recreation services.

WHAT WILL THE PARKS PLAN DO?

The Plan will:

- Identify new parks and facilities, building on previous planning efforts.
- Provide an understanding of what our current parks provide, and learn what the needs are system-wide.
- Update the fees that developers pay (called Parks System Development Charges) to ensure fees are used to build new parks.
- Have clear direction on the short and long term priorities, in order to build the parks and provide the recreation services the community has asked for.

HOW WILL THIS IMPACT MY TAXES?

For the last 10 years, city residents have paid \$.54 per \$1,000 of assessed value to NCPRD. For the median home price, that's \$200 per year. These funds were used to fund recreation programs and pay for park maintenance throughout the entire district. Next spring, Happy Valley will propose a parks levy to replace these funds. The City anticipates the parks levy rate will be a continuation of NCPRD's current rate, or possibly less. This would keep individual property owners' tax responsibility the same and generate approximately \$1.3 million per year in funds that will be spent right here in our community.
